About the Institution

With the motto "Vidya Dadaati Vinayam" – knowledge gives politeness. Govt. College Bhoranj (Tarkwari) Distt. Hamirpur was established in the year 2002. Since its very inception, it has progressively emerged as one of the reputed institutions of the state. This college is situated on Tarkwari – Tauni Devi road at a distance of 4 km. from Tarkwari and 10 km. from Tauni-Devi on the bank of rivulet Kunah near village Kanjian a transit centre of trade in old days.

Spread over an area of about 20 acres, this college has a beautiful campus at the base of hills



covered with lush green pine forest. The college has a building with majestic architectural design. It has a good infrastructure which includes spacious class rooms with sufficient furniture, well equipped science labs, facilities for indoor and outdoor games, computer labs with internet facility, English language lab, Computer lab, well stocked library with reading room, twelve newspapers journals & periodicals and a well furnished conference hall and virtual classroom with latest technology, canteen facility, parking facility for staff & students, staff quarters and solar panel.

The college is affiliated to UGC under section 2f and 12(b) of UGC Act, 1956 and to Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla. This college has been awarded Grade-'B' with CGPA of 2.37 by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) of UGC in April, 2024. This college has been conferred with the status of "UTKRISHT MAHAVIDYALYA" in January, 2021 and Institution of Excellence in March, 2024 by Govt. of Himachal Pradesh. The college has secured rank 12 in overall ranking in tier-I and rank 1 in tier-II of rural colleges as per the recent ranking on the basis of self assessment report (SAR) conducted by The Directorate of Higher Education, Himachal Pradesh in November, 2024. It offers undergraduate course in Humanities, Science (Medical & Non-Medical) and Commerce. In Humanities, eleven subjects are being taught in this college. To meet the growing demand of the computer professionals at all levels, a three year degree course of Bachelor of Computer Application (BCA), Post Graduate Diploma in Computer Application (PGDCA) under self financing scheme is running in the college. The college also offers M.A. in English, Hindi & Political Science since 2024. For effective and qualitative teaching, most of the departments are using latest teaching aids like Lectern, Smart Boards, LCD Multimedia Projector etc. The professionally competent faculty of different departments is fully geared to groom the students to enable them to face the challenges of the job market with skill and confidence.

During the session 2024-25, 484 students got enrollment in this college, with majority of girl students. In the current session the number is likely to exceed in comparison to previous year strength. The college has a unit of National Service Scheme (NSS), a unit of Rovers & Rangers, Red-Ribbon Club, Eco Club, Road Safety Club, Electoral Literacy Club and various cultural & Subject societies to offer optimum opportunities to students to develop the spirit of social service, communal harmony, discipline, mutual co-operation, quality of leadership and sense of responsibility. The institution has a career counseling and placement cell helps the students in providing the information for selection of career and placement through various governments and private agencies. The college publishes its magazine "TAARIKA" annually which provides a forum for students with a flair for writing. It gives vent to their thoughts and perceptions. 

Admission Procedure and Criteria



(B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. 1st year and M.A. 1st Semester) Guidelines and General Instructions:

- 1. The candidates seeking admission to the above classes should apply online. The form, complete in all respects, is to be filled in by the candidate and copies of the documents uploaded along with must be submitted through the college website **www.gcnhoranj.info**
- 2. A student applying for admission in B.A. I year is advised to give two subjects courses of his/her choice, choosing at least one course from each group (page 11). But the allotment of courses (DSC-1 & DSC-2) to the student will be purely on merit basis.
- 3. Subject wise merit list will be displayed on the college website and the college notice board on the scheduled dates.
- **4.** The admission forms of the candidates appearing in the merit list will be scrutinized online by the concerned Admission Committee.
- 5. The admission form recommended by the Admission Committee and approved by the Final Admission Committee entitles a student to deposit the prescribed fee within the stipulated period.
- 6. A candidate who fails to deposit the fee dues by the prescribed date and time shall forfeit her right to admission and the seat shall be offered to the next student in the merit list for which the notices will be displayed on the official website, accordingly. In no case shall the third merit list be issued.
- 7. In case of tie in selection, the candidate older in age shall be given weightage.
- 8. Roster for reservation of seats in various categories shall be as per rules of H.P.U., Shimla.
- 9. Incomplete admission forms and those without copies of uploaded documents will not be entertained.
- 10. No admission, whatsoever, shall be made after the due date.
- 11. All admissions will be as per admission schedule notified by D.H.E. & H.P.U. Shimla from time to time.

Documents and Certificates Required to be Uploaded while Applying for Admission

- 1. Passport size photograph (Coloured & Latest Photograph)
- 2. Copy of Matriculation certificate. (Proving Date of Birth)
- 3. Copy of detailed mark sheet of the previous examination last attended.
- 4. Copy of original Character certificate from the Head of the Institution last attended or character certificate issued by a Gazetted Officer in case of a private candidate. The character certificate should not be older than 6 months on the day of admission.
- 5. Copy of certificate issued by competent authority for availing benefit of **reservation** in the category concerned.
- 6. Copy of Bonafide Himachali Certificate for the exemption of Tuition Fee (in case of girls only).
- 7. A documentary evidence declaration as the proof of activities for the **period of gap** in the academic career.
- 8. An equivalence eligibility certificate from HP Board/ University for the candidates who have passed previous examination from a Board/Uni. other than HPBSE/HPU.
- **9.** Copy of **original migration certificate** for the candidates who have passed last exam from Board/University other than the H.P.Board of School Education/H.P. University.
- 10. Copy of Aadhar card.
- **11.** Number of seats in under graduate programmes (B.A./B.Sc./B.Com.) are limited i.e 80 seats in each discipline that is being offered by this college. One seat each reserve for over and above the allotted seats for single girl child in each course.
- Note: Admission without any of the above-mentioned documents shall be purely provisional and at the candidate's own risk. The candidate must produce all his/her original certificates for verification when demanded by the Admission Committee/college office on the dates displayed on the notice board and the college website.

Eligibility for Admission in B.A./B.Sc./B.Com.

i. **B.A. Pass Course:** The students who have passed +2 examinations or an examination equivalent thereto, accepted as equivalent thereto, by various bodies of H.P. University with 33% marks (including English). The students opting for Mathematics as one of the subjects of study must have 45% marks in

aggregate or 45% marks in Mathematics at +2 level. However, a student who has passed qualifying examination in Arts stream will be given preference in B.A. programme.

- ii. **B.Sc. Pass Course:** +2 examinations or an examination equivalent thereto, accepted as equivalent thereto, by various bodies of H.P. University with pass marks in five subjects (three Science subjects & one English) with 45% marks. The students seeking admission in B.Sc. I year (Non- Medical) have the option to choose either Chemistry or Computer Science as one of the Discipline Specific Courses for study.
- iii. B.Com. Pass Course: The minimum eligibility condition for a student to get admission in B.Com is 33% marks in +2 examinations. However, a student who has passed qualifying examination in Commerce stream will be given preference in the Commerce programme. The candidates opting for Commerce from other streams must have passed Mathematics /Economics as compulsory subjects at +2 level with a minimum of 45% marks.
- iv. All the admissions in BA/B.Sc./B.Com. programme will be made on the merit of +2 examination, taking into consideration the best five subjects including English as one of the subjects.
- v. The students placed under compartment or failed in +2 examination are not eligible for admission in the college.
- vi. Admission against quota meant for outstanding sportsperson and outstanding students in cultural activities shall be made only once in the beginning of the session. These students must also qualify the minimum eligibility conditions for admission in that course as provided under rules.
- vii. Only those students will be considered for Sports quota who have participated in the District /State /National Level Tournaments
- viii. Only those students who have secured 1st, 2nd or 3rd position in District /State /National Level in cultural events will be considered for the quota meant for outstanding students in cultural activities.
- ix. It will be mandatory for the students admitted against Sports and Cultural quotas to participate in sports /cultural events.
- x. Original certificates will have to be produced when demanded by the college authority. The dates for the same will be displayed on the college website and notice board.
- xi. The roster for reservation of seats for various categories shall be as per HP. University, Shimla.

Upper Age Limit

- i. An applicant must not be more than 23 years of age (25 years in case of girl students) as on July 1, 2025. A relaxation of 3 years is applicable to candidates belonging to SC/ST category.
- ii. The Vice-Chancellor, H.P.U. may, in exceptional cases/circumstances, to be recorded in writing, give relaxation in age up to a maximum of 6 months to any candidate. All such cases of age relaxation of up to six months may be granted admission provisionally by the Principal and a consolidated list of all such cases will be sent for approval of the Vice-Chancellor by 31 October of every academic year.

iii. Relaxation in upper age limit is also admissible to physically challenged candidates.

Note: All admissions made by the college are provisional till regularized by H.P. University.

The Choice Based Credit System (CBCS)

This system is a transformation of earlier system which not only introduces innovations but also develops the learner-centric approach. This system allows flexibility in education system so that students depending upon their interests can choose inter-disciplinary, intra-disciplanary and skill based courses. This system not only offers opportunities and avenues to learn core subjects but also explore additional avenues of learning beyond the core subjects for holistic development of student.

The student in this system has considerable freedom in choosing courses and so making his/her own personalized programme/bouquet in cafeteria mode keeping in mind necessary requirements of a course. Except for the compulsory and core courses of the subject of his/her major, he/she is free to choose courses of his/her choice. The programme is considered completed when the student cumulates the requisite number of successful credits (passed).

Choosing Courses of Study

- 1. At the time of admission student will identify/select a discipline/programme of study of his/her choice out of the above mentioned disciplines/programmes of study. The main discipline/programme of study will be one in which he/she will concentrate and will study specified no. of courses according to type of degree allowed as per rules of HPU Shimla.
- 2. Besides, the student will also select one/two assisting disciplines based on the subject / combination availability in college and in consultation with admission committee. The student will have to study these subjects as allied disciplines.

1. A candidate will have to list four subjects/courses of his/her choice, choosing atleast one from each group given above.

2. Out of four courses listed/choosen by the candidate DSC-I and DSC-II will be allotted to the candidate, purely on merit bases.

Note: A candidate can not opt two practical subjects as DSC-I and DSC-II.

Reservation of Seats for Admission in Various Courses

The college follows the reservation policy of H. P. Government and H. P. University in admissions. The following reservations are available, which are filled according to the reservation roster devised by H. P. University:

These reservations will be applicable to those who have passed their qualifying examination from H. P. Board of School Education or from any other schools located within the territorial jurisdiction of Himachal Pradesh or bonafide resident of Himachal Pradesh. Seats under Sports and Cultural quotas will be allotted to those students who have participated in events recognised by H. P. U. Sports and Co-Curricular Council. The final decision to allot seats in these quotas will be with the respective committees constituted for the same. For reservation, the following roster will be followed:

ADMISSIONS AND COURSE GUIDELINES B.A./B.Sc./B.Com II & III YEAR

- Admission to the above classes is open on Roll-on basis. In Roll-on system, the students who have studied in I and II year in the previous session are allowed to take provisional admission in the next class i.e. in II and III year respectively, without waiting for the final result of the previous year.
- However, these students will have to fulfill all the formalities laid down by the college authorities like filling up of the online admission form and depositing the prescribed fee within the stipulated date and time. Admission schedule as notified by H.P University will be displayed on the notice board and official website of the college.
- DSC-1 and DSC-II subjects, once chosen/allotted in B.A. I and B.Sc. 1 year cannot be changed in II or III year of B.A/B.Sc.
- The students getting admission in II year will have to study two Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC 1 & SEC-2) in the DSC 1 or DSC 2 subjects/disciplines of their choice studied in first year, in addition to the courses DSC-1, DSC-2, Compulsory English/MIL in BA/B.Com and DSC-1, DSC-2, DSC-3 in B.Sc. SEC/AEEC in II and III years will be from DSC-1 or DSC-2 subject allotted in first year.
- The students seeking admission in BA/B.Com III year will study the Discipline Specific Elective (DSE-1, DSE-2) courses in the subjects/disciplines studied earlier. SEC-3 and SEC-4 in the subject of their first choice studied and two courses of Generic Elective (GE-1 & GE-2) in an unrelated subject/discipline
- The students in B. Sc III year will have to study the DSE-1, DSE-2, DSE-3 courses in the subjects/disciplines selected earlier and SEC-3 SEC-4 in the subject of their first choice studied.
- Generic subjects in B.A III year will be any subject other than the DSC-1 and DSC-2 (Generic subjects will be allotted by the college).

Note:

- The students of B.A / B.Sc. /B.Com. II must choose the SEC course from one of the DSC-1 and DSC-2 courses opted by them in the First year
- A candidate who fails to fill the online admission form and deposit the prescribed fee within stipulated period in Roll-on System will not be allowed to attend the classes and appear in annual examinations.
- All the candidates are directed to strictly adhere to the timeline prescribed by the H. P. University.

Guidelines and Conditions for Obtaining Degree

- ► A candidate has to earn 132 credits for pass course degree in B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. programme.
- An undergraduate degree in Humanities/Social Sciences/Commerce disciplines may be awarded if a student completes 4 Core papers each in two disciplines of choice, 2 Core papers each in English and MIL respectively, 2 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC), minimum 4 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) and 2 papers each from a list of Discipline Specific Elective based on 2 disciplines of choice selected above, respectively and 2 papers from the list of Generic Elective papers (See Table 1).
- ➤ An undergraduate degree in Science discipline may be awarded if a student completes 4 (DSC) Core papers each in three disciplines of choice, 2 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC), minimum 4 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) and 2 Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) courses each in three discipline of choice (See Table 2).
- Every student shall be required to undergo a regular course of study i.e., attendance in lectures, tutorials, seminars, practical etc., in order to be eligible to appear for University examination. A candidate should attain 75% attendance in each of the concerned courses in Theory and Practical, separately.
- Internal Assessment/Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA) and Annual Examination will be as per HPU guidelines.
- In Annual System the minimum qualifying marks is 40% in aggregate. However, to score 35% marks in each CCA and Final Examination (separately) will be compulsory. For practicals, 40% passing marks will be mandatory.
- A candidate failing either in one or two subjects/papers in annual examination will be placed under compartment in those subjects/papers. Such students will have only two chances, one at supplementary stage and another at the annual stage, to clear the compartment.
- A candidate failing in three or more subjects/papers will be treated as FAIL, in that year and will have to repeat the entire year.
- The results will be declared as per grading system and the students will have to complete the degree within 5 years.

Note: The above guidelines/conditions may vary as per the latest notification by the H.P. University.

Evaluation System

As per H.P. University guidelines, the marks scheme for all undergraduate courses in annual system for B.A./B.Com programme will be in the ratio of 70:30 i.e., 70 marks for theory (annual examination) and 30 marks for Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA)/Internal Assessment (IA). For all the courses of B.Sc. programme, the ratio will be 50:20:30 i.e., 50 marks for theory (annual examination), 20 marks for practical (annual examination) and 30 marks for CCA/IA respectively.

The 30% marks of CCA will be determined by the concerned teacher on the basis of the following components:

1 Mid-Term Test-10 marks

- 2. Class Test-5 marks
- 3. Assignments/Seminars 10 marks

4. Class Room Attendance-5 marks

Class room attendance will be defined as follows:

- >75% but < 80% = 1 mark.
- > 80% but < 85% = 2 marks
- > 85% but < 90% = 3 marks
- >90% but <95% =4 marks
- >95% = 5 marks

Note: Class tests will be conducted by the teacher on the completion of 40% of the syllabi and Mid-Term Test on the completion of 75% of the syllabi.



MID-TERM TESTS

- > One Mid-Term Test of 10 marks in each course will be conducted in the academic year.
- It is mandatory for every student to appear in the Mid-Term Test and the marks obtained shall contribute to the total CCA of 30%.
- ➤ As per University guidelines, the students who do not get 35% marks in CCA and fail to have minimum 75% class room attendance will not be allowed to appear in annual examination.

ACCUMULATION OF CREDITS (NEW PATTERN)

At the end of the programme, if student successfully accumulates 132 credits he/she will be awarded UG degree as per the rule laid down by HP University Shimla.

Grievances and Redressal Mechanism

The students will have the right to make an appeal against any component of evaluation. Such appeal has to be made to the Principal of the College on a prescribed form and should clearly state in writing the reason(s) for the complaint/appeal. The appeal will be placed before the Grievance Redressal Committee (GRC), Chaired by the College Principal, comprising:

- 1. For cases pertaining to the Discipline specific courses (core or elective courses): the Head of the Department, Course Teacher, and a senior Teacher of the Department.
- 2. For cases pertaining to the Electives of the Discipline specific courses: the Head of the Department (of the Major), Course Teacher, and a senior Teacher of the Department of the Elective Discipline Specific Subject.

The Committee will consider the case and may give a personal hearing to the appellant before deciding the case. The decision of the Committee will be final.



Eligibility for Admission in Master of Arts (M.A.)

M.A. English, M.A. Hindi & M.A. Political Science

The admission to 20 seats each in M.A. English, M.A. Hindi & M.A. Political Science will be on the basis entrance test conducted by HP University. Interested students have to apply separately after the declaration of the result to the respective college.

Bachelor's degree of a University established by law of India (with the subject of study for Master of Arts as one of the subjects) in 2nd division or with at least 45% marks (40% in case of SC/ST candidates) or Honours in the subject concerned.

a) Provided that the candidates who have passed the qualifying examination with arts stream shall be given admission to M.A. programme.

b) An applicant must not be more than 26 years for boys & 28 years for girls (29 years in case of SC/ST candidates for boys & girls) of age as on 1st July of current academic year. However in case of overage, the Vice-Chancellor may allow age relaxation upto three years is allowed as per rules.

- c) An applicant failing in all subjects or having a compartment in Graduation will not be admitted.
- d) The admission will be on the basis of merit, as the seats are limited in all faculties.

Rules for Admission

- 1. Admission to 1st semester is restricted to the availability of seats in the concerned programme i.e., the admission will be strictly on merit and roster as per the H.P.U.
- 2. Criterion for admission will be marks obtained in graduation examination. However, if the last two/more students have same marks in the HPU competitive exam then the student having more marks by (CGPA) in graduation will be given preference. In case of same CGPA, date of birth will be criteria.
- 3. For "Sports/Cultural Quota" admission, the applicant should be "State Level Medalist & above".
- 4. The name of a student will be struck off from the rolls of the college if he/she remains absent without leave continuously for ten days in any class/subject (Theory/Practical) In case the name of a candidate is struck off, the re-admission in permissible within 1st seven days with first re-admission fee of Rs. 100/- on a prescribed proforma. If the candidate fails to seek re-admission within first seven days then he/she should seek re-admission up to 12 days, on payment of Rs. 200 as second readmission fee on the personal presence of parents/guardian. After 12 days frm the date of his/her name is struck off, there shall no re-admission in any case.
- 5. In PG courses one seat is reserved to single girl child (students must produce documentary evidence to avail the benefit.

Fines and Penalties

- 1. In case a student does not deposit his/her dues on the dates notified, his/her name will be struck off from the College rolls at the end of the month.
- 2. The name of a student will also be struck off from the college rolls if he/she remains absent without sanctioned leave continuously for 10 days or more.

Why to Study Bachelor of Computer Applications?

BCA is a popular course and considered as one of the standard choice for students who wish to be a part of computer applications graduate community. The course content is designed so as to include the basic architecture of computer and various specialized subjects like networking, database, etc. in order to introduce different horizons of computer application.

About Bachelor of Computer Applications

BCA Course is a three year degree course which is split in six semesters in the CBCS system. The course is being run under self financing scheme and is duly approved by H.P. Govt., affiliated by H.P.University. After successful completion of this course, the student will get the degree of Bachelor of Computer Application from HP University. The total number of seats in BCA 1st Semester are 50 and 1 seat is reserved for single girl child over and above the allotted seats. The admission to the course is open under two categories:

NOTE : As per university rules, 75% seats will be filled out of the candidate who have passed their 10+2 examination from the schools in Himachal Pradesh irrespective of the Board. Remaining 25% seats will be filled on all India bases. Other reservation rules of H.P University shall be applicable.

ELIGIBILITY CONDITIONS

Candidates who have passed 10+2 examination from H.P. Board /CBSE/ICSE or any other examination considered equivalent to 10+2, by the Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla-5, with 40% Marks (35% marks for SC/ST category), shall be eligible.

AGE LIMIT

Maximum age limit for the admission in BCA Course is 21 years for general category, 24 years for SC/ST category and 23 years for girls candidate as on 1 July, 2025. The Vice-chancellor of HPU may permit the age relaxation upto maximum of 6 months.

MODE OF SELECTION

The admission to BCA course will be made on the basis of merit of the qualifying examination.

Note: Admission to BCA Ist Year will be done as per the final decision of the Government of Himachal Pradesh.



Scheme of Examination

The pass percentage in each subject will be 40%.

(i) Theory Papers

For Regular students each paper will be of 100 marks (70 marks for theory exam and 30 marks for internal assessment) and duration of each paper will be 3 hours.)

ii Practical Examination

Maximum Marks:50

Internal: 25 External: 25 Duration:3 hours.

Project Work

In the 6th semester, the student has to develop one project, which will be evaluated by the external examiner from the panel submitted to the Chairman, Computer Science Department, Himachal Pradesh University and duly approved by the university authority/evaluation branch, Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla on the following basis:

- Project Report 1.
- 10 Marks
- 2. Seminar
- 10 Marks (to be evaluated internally)
- 3. Viva-Voce
- 30 marks

FEE STRUCTURE

Subsidized Seats

The candidates admitted against the subsidized seats shall be required to pay the fee in two installments. Rs. 7555 at the time of admission in 1st, 3rd and 5th semester as first installment and Rs. 6240 as second installment at the time of 2nd, 4th and 6th semester.

Non Subsidized Seats

The candidates admitted against the Non-subsidized seats shall be required to pay the fee in two installments. Rs. 19805 at the time of admission in 1st, 3rd and 5th semester as first installment and Rs. 6240 as second installment at the time of 2nd, 4th and 6th semester.

Refundable Security

All the BCA 1st year students will be required to deposit a refundable security of Rs. 1000/- at the time of admission in the college. The students can apply for refund of security within one year after the session is over. i.e. 30th April of next year.

NOTE : Fee once deposited shall be refunded as per instructions of HPU/HP Govt.

A candidate who has passed Bachelor degree in any discipline with atleast 50% marks (45% marks in case of SC/ST candidates) from a university established by law in India.

Age Limit

Candidate seeking admission in PGDCA programme shall not be more than 26 years for male candidate 28 years for female candidate and 29 years for SC/ST candidate as on 1st July, 2025.

MORE ABOUT COLLEGE

Library

There are about 7784 books in the college library. In addition to various reference books and general books, the library has a regular subscription of major dailies magazines and periodicals. All students can have access to these during the working hours on all working days. The following rules and regulations are to be observed in relation to library by the students.

- 1. Maintain silence in and around the library.
- 2. Always keep your identity card with you.
- 3. All the students on the roll of the college shall be eligible to become the member of the college library.
- 4. Every student is entitled to draw two books for reading at home for a period of thirty days from the college library.
- 5. Reference books will not be issued. These can only be consulted in Library.
- 6. In case a book is found mutilated, torn, defaced, or misplaced the actual cost of book plus 20% of the original cost will be charged from such defaulter students.
- 7. Students can get their library security refunded within one year after leaving the college, otherwise the security will stand forfeited.
- 8. Computer facility has been provided in library with internet.
- 9. Photostat and printing facility has also been made available in Library. The cost per page of Photostat is Rs. 1/-and printing is Rs. 5.

Tutorial

Students will be divided into different tutorial groups for the purpose of academic excellence and greater interactions between the teachers and taught. The teacher in charge of each group will provide assistance regarding academics and other activity periodically

National Service Scheme (NSS)

To inculcate the quality of leadership, social service, discipline and patriotism among the youth, the college is running NSS. Presently the college has one NSS unit with 100 students. The students who attend 240 hours of social service and one 07 days special camp are given a special benefit of 2% marks at the time of admission to the H.P.University P.G. Courses.

Rovers & Rangers (R&R)

The college has two units Rovers and Rangers which is an international association of volunteers. The college has two wings. There are 20 seats in each wing. The students who obtain a NIPUN certificate are eligible for 2% marks weightage while seeking employment in Railways and other Govt. institutions.

Parent-Teachers Association (PTA)

This association has been working actively since the year 2003. PTA contributes towards the improvement of the college infrastructure and provides assistance as per requirements of the college.

Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC)

On 2nd and 4th Saturday the teachers of the college give the special attention to the students by imparting necessary guidance, increasing general awareness and addressing their problems within the frame work of the respective time-table.

Sports

Inter-faculty Athletic/Sports meet is organized in college every year. In this event various sports events are organized. The winning students are awarded prizes and medals.

College Magazine 'TAARIKA'

To nurture the creativity of the students, the College Magazine 'TAARIKA' is published every year. It has many sections like Hindi, Sanskrit, Pahari, English, Science and Economics, Commerce etc. One student editor for each section is also appointed.

Extension Lectures

The extension Lectures are organized by various faculties for the benefit of students. The speakers are invited from various prestigious research and educational institutions.

Educational Tour

Educational Tours are also organized by college for providing exposure to students. For this, students will have to submit a written proposal to the committee through their subject incharge. The committee finalizes the tour and completes all formalities. The college provides limited financial support as permitted in rules. The students will have to bring a No Objection Certificate from their parents before proceeding on tour.

Drama Club

The college has a dramatic club which organizes the activities of plays, skits and mime in the college from time to time. Students who are having the potential of acting and theater are eligible to become members of this club. The club also participates in HPU youth festival Group-IV.

CODE OF CONDUCT

Attendance

1.75% lecture attendance and 20% marks in each subject in Mid-Term Examinations is compulsory for appearing in the End-year examinations.

2.An irregular student or one who remains absent continuously for 10 days his or her name will be struck-off from the college rolls. If the name of the student is struck-off twice then he/she will not be re-admitted in the college.

Fee for first readmission is Rs. 100/- while for second readmission is Rs. 200/-

3.A student is liable to pay all dues and fines as long as his/her name remains on the college Rolls.



4. Principal reserves the right to refuse, expel or suspend any student from the College on any disciplinary ground or without assigning any reason.

Leave Rules

1. Application for any kind of leave on the prescribed Performa should be submitted well in time.

2.Leave up to three days will be sanctioned by the tutor. But in case of the leave a single period the concerned teacher may be asked

3.Leave more than three days will be sanctioned by the senior tutor. Leave for more than 7 days will be sanctioned by the Principal on the recommendation of concerned subject teacher/senior tutor.

4 In case of medical leave for a period of over 7 days the applicant must produce a medical certificate.

Students participating in inter-college competition should note that the practice/rehearsal timings should be either before the classes (Morning hours) or after the classes (Evening hours) because all activities form apart, but not the substitute of the academics/studies.

IDENTITY CARD

- 1. Every student will be issued an identity card. Every student must always keep/carry it with him/her and must produce whenever required (during all working days, examination and college function etc). Otherwise, he/she will be considered as an outsider and will be punished accordingly.
- 2. In case the Identity card is lost, a duplicate card will be issued only after an FIR is registered with the nearest police station and an original copy there of this appended with such request.
- 3. For obtaining duplicate card, student shall have to pay Rs. 20/- besides a copy of FIR and stamp size photo with scanned signature

PROCEDURE FOR GETTING IDENTITY CARD

After depositing admission fee and dues, every student will get an identity card from the college library on showing his/her receipt. After having affixed his/her own photograph and filled in all entries in the I-card, every student must get it duly signed by the principal and respective senior tutor within one week from the date of admission positively.

GENERAL CONDUCT AND DISCIPLINE RULES

Any of the following activities will be considered as breach of discipline.

- 1. Graffiti i.e. any sort of writing on the walls/black board/rooms/desks etc.
- 2. Damaging the college property.
- 3. Loitering about the corridors and causing disturbance to the classes.
- 4. Possession and use of intoxicants and smoking in the college campus.
- 5. Bringing outsiders to the college with them.
- 6. Sticking any kind of bills/notices on the notice boards, on the walls of the premises or in the college campus without prior permission of the Principal.
- 7. Creating any kind of violence in the campus.
- 8. Coming to the college without Identity Card.

ZERO TOLERANCE TO RAGGING

ALL STUDENTS MUST NOTE THAT RAGGING INSIDE/OUTSIDE THE COLLEGE IS A COGNIZABLE OFFENCE

Ragging in and out of the College Campus/roads/approaches leading there to is found indulging in ragging directly or indirectly, the college authorities shall be obliged under rule 22, 17(a) (b) (c) of H.P. University ordinance to expel the guilty student from the college and initiate legal action.



Ragging means the following

"Ragging includes any type of physical or mental torture inflicted by any individual or group, whether by words spoken or written or by any act which has effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness any other student, including in rowdy or undisciplined activities which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in a fresher or a junior student or asking the student to do any act or perform something which such student will not in ordinary cause and which has the effect of or generating a sense of shame or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of fresher or a junior student which creates an apprehension in the mind of the person that he/she can not peruse his/her studies free from any mental disturbance or torture created thereby any person who aids or abets such an action shall be guilty of such ragging".

Punishable Ingredients of Ragging

1) Abetment to ragging; 2) Criminal conspiracy to rag; 3) unlawful assembly and rioting while ragging; 4) public nuisance created during ragging; 5) Violation of decency during ragging; 6) Injury to body, causing hurt or grievous hurt; 7) Wrongful restraint; 8) Wrongful confinement; 9) Use of criminal force; 10) Assault as well as sexual offences or unnatural offences; 11) Extortion; 12) Criminal trespass; 13) Offences against the victim(s); 14) physical or offences following definition of "Ragging".

Any student found involved in ragging in any form whatsoever will be punished appropriately which may include:

- 1. Imprisonment, fine or both
- 2. Expulsion from the College.
- 3. Suspension from the classes.
- 4. Withholding scholarship or other benefits
- 5. Fine with public apology.
- 6. Debarring from representation in events.

Ragging is a Reprehensible Act under Himachal Pradesh Educational Institutions (Prohibition of Ragging) Ordinance - 2009
