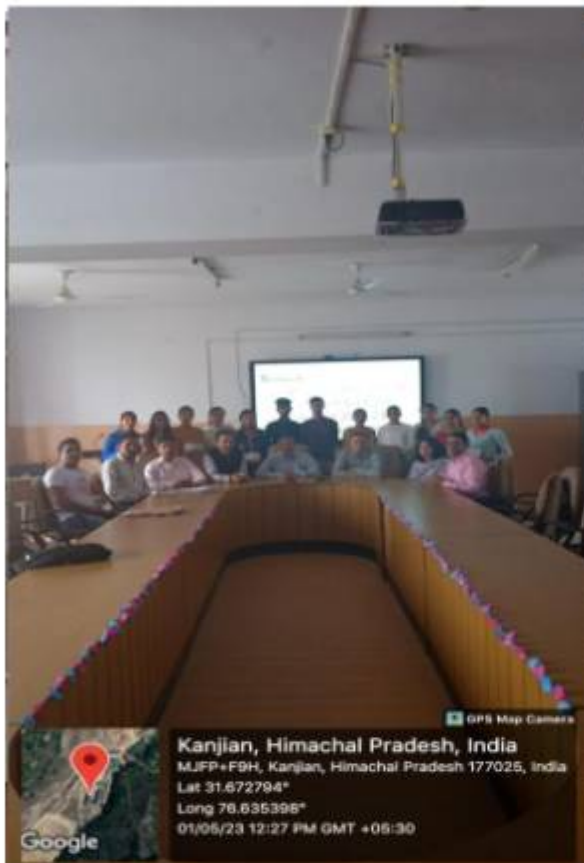

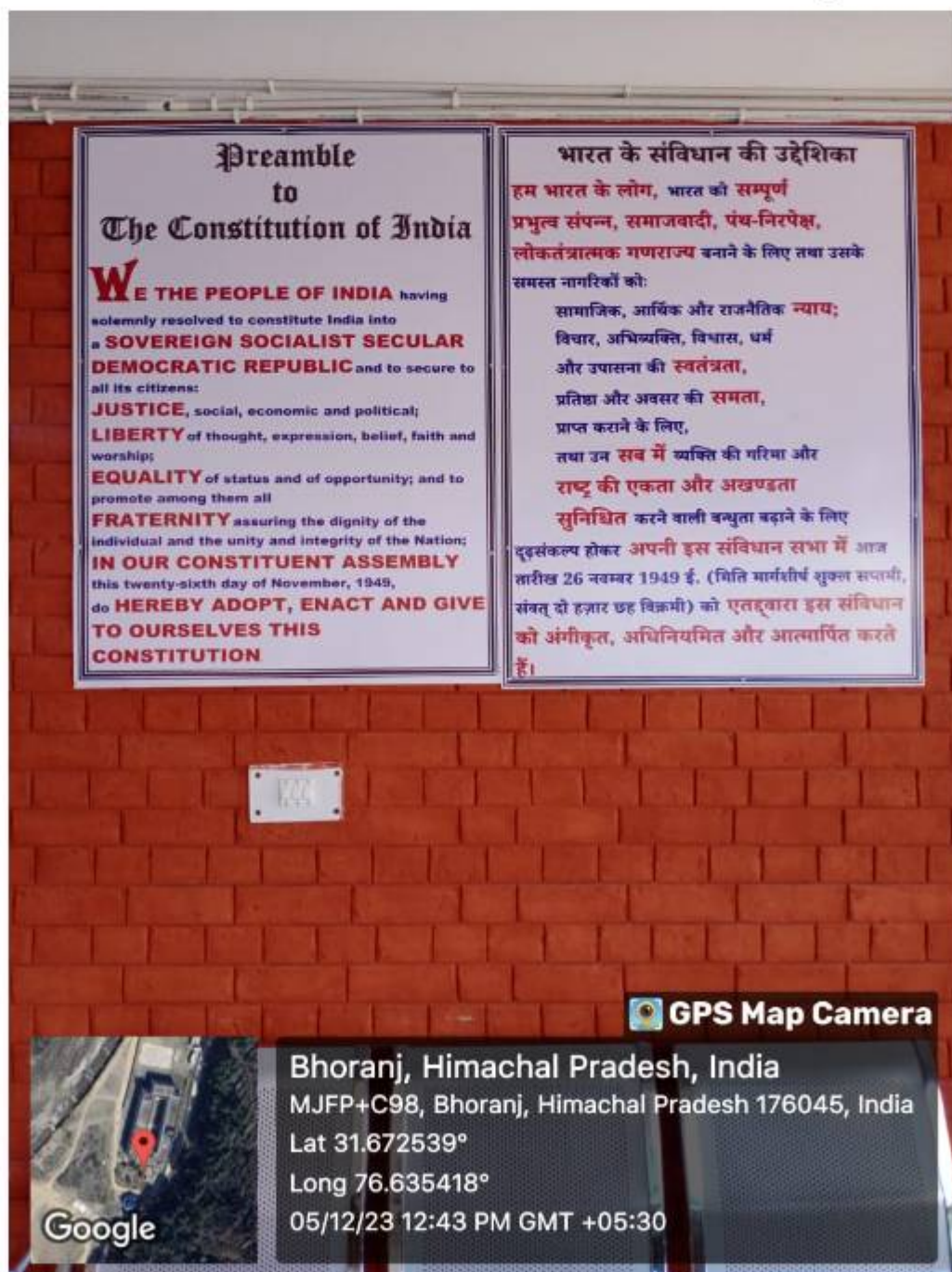

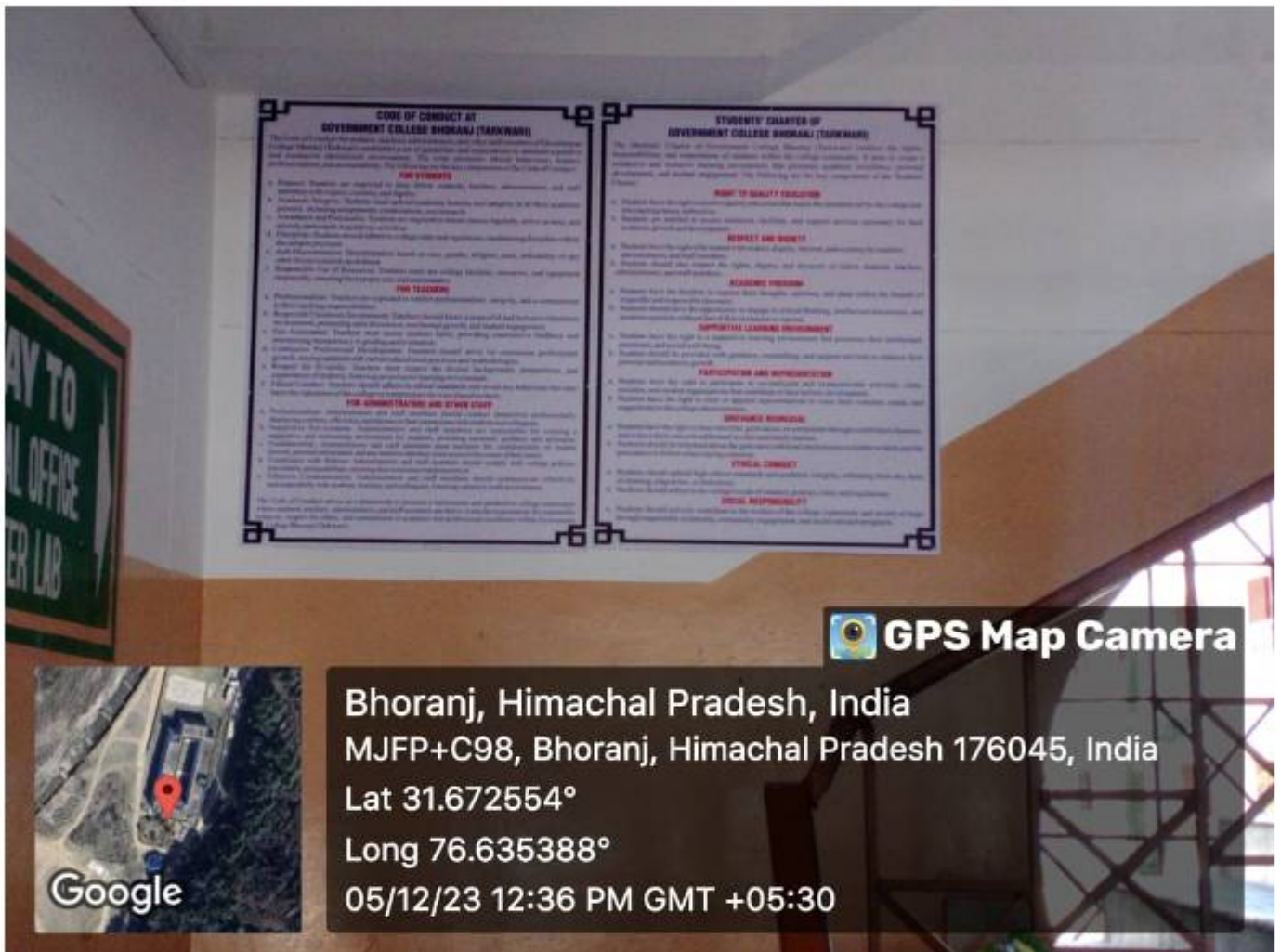


Sensitization about Cleanliness by NSS Unit (Swachh Bharat Abhiyan)

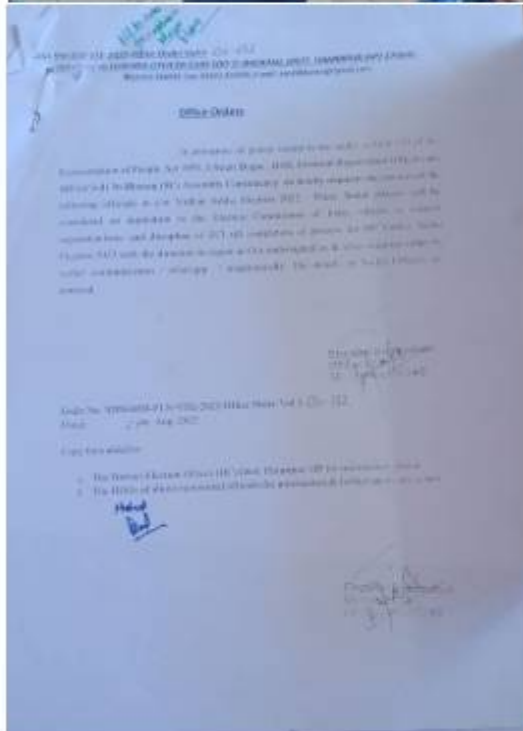




Sensitization about Road Safety by RTO Hamirpur
